

## Suggested Tools

Simply Scoring Tool
Fringe Scissors or paper snips
1 3/8" Circle punch
Glue Gun
Glue Sticks
Fall Leaf Die

Stampin Up Silicone Mat
Paper Snips
Stampin Up New Paper Trimmer
Soft Suede Cardstock or Designer Paper - 1 Sheet

## **Instructions:**

Plug in glue gun. Ensure it is on your silicone mat or in a plastic holder to keep the adhesive from spreading on the table or your project.

Punch Sixteen 1 3/8" circles out of cardstock/cardstocks scraps of "any" color as it will not be seen once the pumpkin is completed

Score all your Pumpkin Pie cardstock at  $\frac{1}{2}$ " increments on your Simply Scored. Trim cardstock or patterned paper (for pumpkin) to the following sizes:

$$(4 \text{ pieces}) - 2" \times 12", (4) - 2 \frac{1}{2}" \times 12", (4) - 2 \frac{3}{4}" \times 12", (2) - 3" \times 12", (2) - 2 \frac{7}{8}" \times 12"$$

Ink edges of cardstock if desired with Pumpkin Pie or Soft Suede Classic Ink

Starting with the (4 pieces) - 2"  $\times$  12" which have been scored at the 1/2" marks, adhere ends together either with a glue gun, SNAIL adhesive or small stapler (it's your choice) and create a rosette. This will give you  $\underline{TWO}$  sets which will end up being 2"  $\times$  24" long. So essentially take the four pieces and make 2 longer pieces, close them up to make two loops, and proceed to make it a rosette. Use the 1 3/8" punched circles to adhere the rosette, one on the bottom and another on top.

Continue making rosettes, using the following pieces to create the remaining:

(4 pieces) - 2 1/2" x 12" =  $\frac{2 \text{ sets}}{4}$  of 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 24", (4) - 2 3/4" x 12" =  $\frac{2 \text{ sets}}{4}$  of 2  $\frac{3}{4}$ " X 24", (2) - 3" x 12=  $\frac{1 \text{ sets}}{4}$  of 3" X 24", (2) - 2 7/8" x 12" =  $\frac{1 \text{ Set}}{4}$ . A total of 8 rosettes will be made. Adhere the rosettes together to create a pumpkin. (Note: Number of rosettes can be changed to alter the look of the pumpkin).

Using glue to create the stem, cut two 1 1/2" x 11" strips of Soft Suede cardstock using the fringe scissors (be sure to leave a "minimum" of  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from edge of strip, fringe the strips!. Start the roll the first strip into a <u>tight circle</u>, and adhere then next strip using the glue gun. Keep adding strips as desired. If you would like, sponge the stem to give it some dimension with Soft Suede Classic Ink.

Next Adhere leaves to the top of the pumpkin, <u>BEFORE</u> you add the stem to pumpkin with glue gun.

Now adhere the Stem on top of the leaves with enough glue to ensure it will not fall off (don't be chinsey with the hot glue.....lol)

Cut 1/8" strips of Designer Series paper or cardstock and wrap around a pencil to curl. Adhere to tendrils to top of pumpkin on leaves, beside stem.

If you would like to add some additional dimension, spray the pumpkin with some Stampin' Mist to give it some nice sheen.

Walla, your pumpkin is now completed!!

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
