

Mere is Mr. Jobble Jobble.

Here are the layers for his tail. I used our Designer Rosette Bigs XL die (125594) which made the creation super easy! Just cut the width of each cardstock color and run through the die, which cuts and points and scores (yay) all the cardstock for you! If you don't have the die, you can use your Simply Score Tool and score each piece you will need to create his tail feathers.

We start with the Elegant Egyplant Rosette. Cut a piece of Elegant Egyplant cardstock at $2 \frac{3}{4}$ " X 11" and cut 3 strips for every single color of tail feathers. Glue them together to make a large ring for all three colors.

Then we move on to the Bravo Burgundy cardstook cut at 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ X 11" and make 3 strips of these as well.

Now we go to the Always Artichoke Cards tock out at 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " X 11" and make 3 strips of these as well. Punch out 6 circles from the 1 3/8" punch. You will use two circles for each rosette when you "hot glue" them together. One to hold the rosette together on the back and then one in front to add superior adhesion for each layer of feathers.

I drew my own template for the waddle, beak and body of the turkey. I cut 2 cut pieces of the body in Soft Suede for better stability, then Cherry Cobbler cardstock for the waddle, and More Mustard cardstock for the beak.

Once you have all your rosettes glued into circles, center them all together to figure out where you need to ensure they are aligned perfectly up and down. Use your hot glue to adhere them together (use lots of glue to ensure good adhesion since they will seem heavy against the Gobble body.

Once the three rosettes are hot glued together, center and glue the body of the Gobble to the centered rosettes. Then use some chipboard, your favorite cardstock, and the Large Scallop Circle die and run them together through the Big Shot. Use Tombow Multi-purpose glue to adhere the cardstock/Designer Series Paper to the chipboard piece.

Place the Gobble on (what I am calling platter), chipboard covered piece and again, adhere into place with hot glue.

I used our fabulous stamp set Greetings of the season, for the beautiful sentiment found in the Big Catalog.

Here are some of my ladies ideas for their Gobble. I brought in some "real" acorns from my back yard, and my creative crafty ladies, had fun with those! I love how Ms. Rosie placed a little hat on her Gobble by using the top of the acorn. Clever, right? Well I think so!
